OWLS ELIMINATED BY ST JOHNS NWMA

The Slinger Owls participated in a deep and talented Cedar Grove Regional in the 2006 WIAA Division 2 State Tournament. Five of the eight teams in the regional had at least 12 regular season wins.

In the first round, the Owls hosted tournament rival Mayville on Tuesday, February 28th. The Owls jumped out to an early seven-point lead, but the game stayed close throughout. Midway through the fourth quarter, the Cardinals took a four-point lead. Sophomore point guard Austin Kearns answered with a three-point shot to cut the lead to one. Neither team led by more than three points the rest of the way. Mayville still led by one point with 50 seconds to play when Senior Brandon Rothenhoefer scored on a put-back to give the Owls a one point lead. On the ensuing possession, the Owls forced the Cardinals star player into a turnover and Kearns found Rothenhoefer streaking down the floor for a layup giving the Owls a three-point lead with just nine seconds left. Mayville inbounded and called timeout near halfcourt with six seconds left. The Cardinals point guard got off a contested three-point shot that hit the back of the rim, bounced into the air and hit the rim, then bounced into the air and off of the rim one more time as the buzzer sounded giving the Owls a hard-fought 51-48 victory. Senior forward Jeremy Off posted his 16th "double-double" of the season posting 17 points and 10 rebounds, while Austin Kearns also scored 17 points.

The victory advanced Slinger to a Thursday night Regional game at Delafield against St. Johns Northwest Military Academy. The Lancers entered the game with a 20 – 1 record and were ranked third in the state among Division 2 schools. St. Johns featured Wisconsin Badger recruit Trevon Hughes from New York City. After a close first quarter, the Owls trailed 11 – 8. However, the Lancers took control of their home court in the second quarter. Hughes hit a long three-pointer at the halftime buzzer to extend the Lancer lead to 29 – 13. The Owls could get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way, as St. Johns pulled away for a 68 – 42 win. The Owls shot just 33% from the floor for the game. Hughes posted 25 points and 7 assists to lead St. Johns to the convincing victory.

Slinger finished the season with a 14 – 8 overall record, including a 9 – 5 Parkland Conference record, good for a third place finish, in the final year of the conference's existence.

St. Johns captured the Cedar Grove regional championship with a 15-point victory over Campbellsport, and then posted victories over Milwaukee Lutheran and New Berlin Eisenhower in Sectional play to advance to the state tournament in Madison. Eventual state champion Seymour finally upended the Lancers in the semifinal game.
